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Introduction

In the first half of 2005, economic conditions abroad were generally favourable, with solid growth across most regions, except the Euro area. Activity in the countries of particular economic importance to Tonga, including the United States, Australia and New Zealand, reported good economic growth. These countries are the main sources of remittances to Tonga, as well as important destinations for Tonga's exports and major sources of imports. Growth is gaining momentum in Japan, Tonga's major export destination.

Higher world oil prices has been the main external development of concern for Tonga. While the effects on Tonga's consumer price index were muted in the first half of the year, this cannot be relied upon to continue. Higher oil prices have had a direct effect on the balance of trade, underpinning strong growth in imports and placed downward pressure on official foreign reserves. Strong growth in credit has also underpinned growth in imports while foreign exchange receipts have been static. There was little growth in exports over the first half of 2005, tourist receipts fell and growth in remittances eased, resulting in an overall fall in the level of foreign reserves.

Overseas Economic Conditions

External economic conditions remained positive in the first half of 2005. The United States economy expanded at a solid pace, reflecting a strong contribution from domestic demand. Growth in household consumption was underpinned by rising wealth, low interest rates and favourable labour market conditions, while corporate spending was supported by the low cost of capital, strong sales growth and high levels of profitability. Underlying inflation remained contained, as the Federal Reserve raised interest rates; the federal funds rate was increased by 1 percentage point to 3½ per cent by the end of June.

In China, an increasingly important trading partner, activity continued to expand at a rapid pace, following strong growth in 2004. Real GDP increased by 9½ per cent over the year-ended June quarter, underpinned by investment, exports, and more recently, a switch in the production of goods that had previously been imported.

In Japan, growth in activity appears to be improving following a contraction in the second half of 2004. Household consumption over the first half of 2005 was supported by improved labour market conditions, with the unemployment rate falling to a seven-year low. At the same time, the improved financial position of the corporate sector, a high level of capacity utilisation in the manufacturing sector and an improvement in business confidence have underpinned an expansion in business activity. In South-east Asia, growth picked up after easing in 2004. The recovery was particularly evident in Thailand, as well as in South Korea, a potentially important export destination for Tonga's produce.

In Australia, GDP grew solidly over the first half of 2005. Growth in national income continued to be sustained by a rise in the terms of trade to a thirty-year high in the June quarter 2005. The stimulus from the increase in world commodity prices helped to offset the dampening effects from domestic factors. Growth in private consumption eased, reflecting households consolidating their balance sheets against a background of stable dwelling prices and a high level of debt.

Economic growth in New Zealand remained firm, with strong domestic demand supported by a buoyant labour market and rapid growth in wages. In contrast to Australia, a marked rise in house prices in the first half of the year and rapid growth in household borrowing continued to support spending. Resulting capacity constraints prompted the Reserve Bank of New Zealand to increase the official cash rate by 25 basis points in the first half of the year, to 6.75 per cent.

Elsewhere in the Pacific region, growth in Fiji is slowing, though not as sharply as earlier expected. Domestic final demand remains buoyant, underpinned by accommodative financial conditions. On the other hand, growth in production eased in the key industries of garments, gold and sugar.

Domestic Economic Conditions


According to the Ministry of Finance, economic growth in 2004/05 recovered from the low growth in 2003/04. GDP is estimated to have increased by 2.5 per cent in 2004/05, following growth of 1.6 per cent in 2003/04. Improved weather conditions underpinned a recovery in agricultural output, while there was a strong contribution from commerce, hotels & restaurants. Activity in other sectors, including finance & business services and manufacturing contributed moderately to the recovery in activity.

Partial indicators and results from surveys suggest that growth in the period, January-June 2005, was solid, though largely based on the agricultural and wholesale/retail sectors. Construction activity, particularly relating to the non-residential sector, appears to have eased from the strong pace of 2004.

Agricultural Production

The supply of produce to the Talamahu Market remains an important indicator of agricultural production, despite the increased number of markets that are not captured by the official statistics. In the first half of 2005, the volume of produce supplied to the Talamahu Market increased by nearly 20 per cent from a year earlier (*Graph 1*), though the increase was narrowly based on the supply of rootcrops, which comprises just over half of all produce supplied to the market. Other produce, notably bananas and fruit, made only small contributions to the overall increase.

Trade data published by the Department of Statistics confirms the strong growth in the production of rootcrops, with exports increasing by 12 per cent in the year-ended March


Graph 1: Talamahu Market Production

quarter. Exports of other agricultural produce, particularly kava and fish & other marine products, fell in the year-ended March quarter. Overall, total agricultural exports fell by 36 per cent to \$1.9 million, the lowest level in four years.

Tourism

Tourism has important linkages to many sectors of the economy, including commerce, hotels & restaurants, transport & communications and entertainment, recreation & personal services. Together, these sectors comprise around 30 per cent of GDP. Partial indicators suggest that activity in the tourist-related sectors was mixed in the first half of the year. According to overseas exchange transactions of banks, earnings from tourism fell in the first half of 2005 from a year earlier. The number of air arrivals, which includes returning nationals, appears to have plateaued at an annual rate of just over 40,000 (*Graph 2*).

Construction

Activity in the construction sector, which comprises around 15 per cent of the economy, has eased from the strong pace of recent years, reflecting the completion of major non-residential projects, including Tonga High School, the Fund Management Cinema complex and the Ministry of Justice office block. In the first half of 2005, sales of construction materials were slightly below the level of a year earlier, following double digit growth throughout much of 2004. The slowdown is consistent with the easing in construction-related credit from a peak in late 2004.

Wholesale and Retail

Activity in the wholesale & retail sector was buoyant in the first half of 2005, consistent with the strong growth in household and business credit. According to a regular quarterly survey of retailers and wholesalers conducted by the NRBT, sales increased by 15 per cent in the first half of 2005, the strongest rate of growth since the first half of 2002. Growth was broadly based across all categories of expenditure, namely motor vehicles, supermarkets and household goods.

Electricity


Electricity consumption increased by 2.3 per cent in the first half of 2005 from a year earlier. This largely reflected an increase in the average number of consumers, which rose by 4.5 per cent over the same period.

Inflation

Inflation eased to single digits in the first half of 2005, a welcomed outcome given the strong rise in world oil prices. The consumer price index (CPI) rose by 8.1 per cent in the year-ended June, 2 percentage points below the 10.1 per cent rise in the year-ended December 2004 (*Graph 3*). The fall in inflation largely reflected lower contributions from imported food and household operations. Changes to the tax system contributed to the easing in prices growth. On 1 April 2005, the Port and Service Tax, Sales Tax and Fuel Sales Tax were replaced with a consumption tax, while a government subsidy to households for electricity consumption was introduced in June 2005.

Easing inflationary pressures, evident since the end of 2003, were largely driven by prices of imported items, which comprise two thirds of the CPI index. Prices of imported items rose by 5.6 per cent in the year-ended June, down from 7.9 per cent in the year-ended December 2004. Much of the easing reflected lower contributions from food, household operations and clothing & footwear. The contribution from imported transportation costs also eased slightly, despite a significant increase in world oil prices.

Growth in prices of domestic items eased in June 2005, though remained in double digits. Prices of domestic items rose by 13.3 per cent in the year-ended June, down from 14.7 per cent in the year ended December 2003. Most categories reported lower contributions to overall prices growth, which offset continued buoyant local food prices.



2005/06 Budget

The Government Budget for 2005/06, delivered in June, reported a considerably better fiscal outcome for 2004/05 than anticipated at the beginning of the financial year. A fiscal surplus of \$0.7 million (0.1 per cent of GDP) was reported compared with an original estimated deficit of \$10.7 million (2.4 per cent of GDP). The improved outcome largely reflected lower-than-expected expenditures across most categories. Total revenue was broadly consistent with the original estimates.

At the time of the Budget, the Government expected an overall fiscal deficit of \$9.2 million (1.9 per cent of GDP). While revenue and grants were budgeted to increase by \$31 million, expenditure was expected to increase by around \$40 million. The resulting deficit was to be financed by drawdown of overseas loans.

Overseas Exchange Transaction (OET)¹

Overseas exchange transactions reported by banks suggest a large rise in imports, little growth in exports, easing growth in remittances and a higher current account deficit (*Graph 4*). In addition, lower capital inflow suggests that the balance of payments moved into deficit in the first half of 2005.

The value of exports in the first half of 2005 eased slightly from a year earlier, to \$11 million, the lowest level of export receipts since the first half of 2001. In contrast, the



value of imports rose by \$19 million or 23 per cent to an historic high of \$104 million, underpinned by strong growth in business and household credit. The fall in exports and strong growth in imports resulted in a trade deficit of \$93 million, the largest trade deficit over a six-monthly period.

Tonga's growing trade deficit has been funded by net private remittances. Data for the first half of 2005 suggests that the growth in remittances is starting to ease off while growth in private payments have increased over the decade.

The increase in the trade deficit resulted in the current account deficit reaching an historic high of \$18 million, a sharp turnaround from a small surplus of a year earlier. A fall in capital inflow to \$11 million plus unrecorded outflows of \$4 million, resulted in a balance of payments deficit of \$11 million and a fall in foreign reserves.

Graph 4: Overseas Exchange Transactions




Gross Official Foreign Reserves

At the end of June 2005, gross official foreign reserves amounted to \$82.1 million, equivalent to 4.4 months of imports (*Graph 5*). While lower than the peak of \$93.4 million or 5.4 months of imports at the end of December 2004, foreign reserves remained around the minimum level of 3-4 months that the Bank considers to be adequate.


Domestic Financial Conditions

Financial conditions were accommodative in the first half of 2005, evident by the strong growth in liquidity and credit to the private sector. Total liquidity in the banking system increased by 13.4 per cent in the year-ended June 2005 (*Graph 6*) attributed mainly to an increase in term deposits, with little change in the other components, namely demand deposits, savings deposits and foreign currency accounts.

Graph 5: Gross official foreign reserves


Over the year-ended June 2005, the main contribution to total liquidity in the banking system switched from net foreign assets to domestic credit. This reflected the large private capital inflow in the middle of 2004 and the subsequent robust growth in household credit and the recovery in business credit over the past year (*Graph 6*).

Credit to the household sector rose by 42 per cent to \$131 million in the year-ended June 2005, one of the strongest rates of growth on record. Growth was underpinned by solid contributions from housing and personal loans. Total business credit increased by 15 per cent to \$96 million (*Graph 7*). The pace of business credit gained momentum, particularly in the first half of 2005, with growth of 11½ per cent in the June quarter, following growth of 5 per cent in the December quarter 2004 and 6½ per cent in the March quarter 2005.

Lending to ‘other services’ was particularly strong, though lending to this sector remained below the level prior to the offshore refinancing in the middle of 2004. Lending for construction eased in the first half of the year, as several large non-residential building projects were completed.

The government’s net lending position with the banking system increased to an historic high of \$27 million in the first half of 2005. This was an important factor in accommodating the expansion of credit to the private sector.

Average Interest Rates

Interest rates on savings deposits were largely unchanged in the first half of 2005 at around 3.25 per cent, while the interest rate on term deposits rose from around 5.5 per cent to 6.0 per cent, reflecting increased competition among banks for longer-dated funding. The prime business lending rate edged higher to around 9.4 per cent, while the interest rate on owner-occupied housing eased slightly to 10.9 per cent.

Government Bonds

The stock of Government Bonds in circulation totalled \$25.4 million at the end of June 2005, of which 24.2 percent were held by the commercial banks. These bonds were issued at terms ranging from 2 years to 5 years, carrying an interest rate ranging from 5.0 percent per year in nominal terms to 6.75 percent.


The Tongan Pa’anga

On a trade-weighted basis, the Tongan Pa’anga appreciated in the first half of 2005, largely reflecting a significant appreciation against the Japanese yen (*Table 1 and Graph 8*). The pa’anga also appreciated against the Australian dollar, the Fijian dollar and the New Zealand dollar, but depreciated slightly against the United States dollar.

The Real Effective Exchange Rate (REER) index of the Tongan Pa'anga, a measure of international competitiveness which takes into account movements in the prices of Tonga's main trading partners, as well as movements in bilateral exchange rates, rose by 1½ per cent in the first half of 2005. The rise in the real effective exchange rate implies a deterioration in Tonga's competitiveness as domestic inflation outcomes have continued to be higher than in Tonga's trading partners, notwithstanding the recent progress on reducing inflation.



Kalafi 1: Ngoue 'i he Maketi Talamahu











Liliu peseti fakata'u






